Rahul Dravid's praising words on Dhoni "Lavishing praise on Mahendra Singh Dhoni, who has shocked the cricket world be retiring from Tests, former India skipper Rahul Dravid said the stumper-batsman would go down as a captain who led 'more by example than by rhetoric or by words'.

'He was a captain I enjoyed playing under', Dravid told ESPN cricinfo.

'One of the things I liked about MS was, what you saw was what you got. Very uncomplicated, always led by example. One of the things I really liked about playing under MS was that he never asked you to do anything that he himself didn't do', he explained.

Dravid said Dhoni earned the respect of his teammates by setting an example with his own performance.

'The reality was he was having to transition a senior group of players and build a younger group who were coming through', Dravid said.

Walking the Talk

'In a sense he was not the most communicative of captains, but he tried to earn your respect by walking the talk. He never took a backward step, and led more by example than by rhetoric or by words. More by actions', he added.

Dravid said Dhoni deserves credit for inspiring a whole generation of small-town cricketers.

"For someone to come from a small town like Ranchi, to go on and captain India and play 90 test matches, to do it the way he has, I think he brought a lot of dignity to the job of captaincy,' Dravid said.

Own Cup of Tea

'He (Dhoni) might not be everyone's cup of tea, but he was his own cup of tea and he led with a lot of success and

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that can never be taken away from him', Dravid further stated.

'And he's been an inspiration. If there are kids in small towns today dreaming and aspiring for great things, not only in cricket but in various fields, then MS Dhoni has a lot to do with it', he added.

Dravid said Dhoni's retirement was a shock to him as well. The former batsman and had the series, which India has already lost by conceding a 2-0 lead to Australia, still been alive Dhoni could have waited to take a call on his career.

'I guess it was unexpected that he would do it in the middle of the series. I expected him to review it at the end of the series, without India playing Test cricket for the next seven or eight months,' Dravid said.

'Knowing MS, if the series was alive, I don't think he would have taken the decision in the middle of the series, but having seen that the series was already gone, may be he felt that if he was going to go, then may be this was the time to do it, and to give Virat Kohli a Test match in Australia to Captain, Wriddhiman Saha another opportunity in a Test match, and to start the process of taking India's Test team forward'.

Dravid lauded Dhoni's leadership style and called him an attacking captain.

'He was never defensive when captaining in India. When he had spinners, he was always attacking, on turning tracks, he was willing to force the game. It's just overseas, and over the last three or four years, that I just think he may be felt he didn't have the bowling resources to be able to take 20 wickets, and he found himself, at many stages, always behind the four-ball,' Dravid said"².

Voices on Dhoni's retirement are as follows "For him to have gone on to play 90 Tests and become India's most successful captain, coming from a small town like Ranchi, is a phenomenal achievement. One of the things I really liked about playing under MS was that he never asked you to do anything that he himself didn't do" – Rahul Dravid.

"Yes, I was a bit surprised by his decision to retire. But, I always feel retirements are something which are purely personal decisions and one should respect them". – V. V. S. Laxman.

"The decision comes as a huge surprise. I was expecting him to step down after the Sydney Test, but did not think he will retire as a player. I still think that he had 2 or 3 more years of cricket left in him. What he has achieved for Indian cricket is incredible, what he brought and his contribution cannot be measured in words" – Sunil Gavaskar.

"It came as a surprise, didn't it, that he quit midstream. It (decision to quit) could have been taken earlier. But, perhaps, he thought it was the right time to handover the mantle to the next man" – Chandu Borde.

"The decision was extraordinary. I feel he should have waited till the end of the series (after January 6-10 fourth Test at Sydney). He had already missed the first Test (at Adelaide)" – Ajit Wadekar"³.
