Janaki can't tolerate her husband's overbearing dominance. She finds her life to be with ups and downs. She nomore has happiness in her life she just wants to get rid out from the web of her husband. Her response to Akhila is "why should a women life by herself? There is always man willing to be with her" (Ladies coupe 21)

Sheela – A Sensitive Girl

Sheela is the fourteen years old girl. She takes care of the family members. She understand the dynamics of life. Her grandmother teaches her practical life. She gets attached with her grandmother and brings maturity in her life. She knows "women turn to their mother when they have no one else to turn to women know that a mother alone will find it possible to wealth some shred to compassion and love that in everyone else has become ashes" (Lades couple 71). Sheela's grandmother also teaches about men who dominates women physically as well as psychologically. Sheela experiences through her father itself as her father usually says shit, for speaking to boys and for being rude. He encourages her to speak" with a razor - edged wit and a finely developed skill of repartee" (70). When her grandmother dies of cancer, she remembers her "grandmother's words" the only person you used to please is yourself. When you look into a, mirror you reflection should make you feel happy" (Ladies coupe 67). So, she dresses her grandmother's body with jewels. Her maturity is shown by her grandmother teachings. This is revealed by Anita Nair.

Marikolundhu is a girl from rural background. She comes from a poor background. Her mother works as a cook at Chettiar's house which is the richest families in their village. she loses her education. One day, Marikolundhu's mother become ill and she continued her mother's work at Chettiar's house. Her duty was to take care of a child of Sujata akka, the daughter in law of Chettiar. She showers her love and affection upon the child. She hates her son Muthu, who escapes many attempts of abortion. He is the result of seduction by Murugesan. she give birth to a son. Finally she leaves her son at her mother and works in chettiar's family. Sujata's husband also uses Marikolundhu to fulfill his sexual desires. On knowing this Sujata sends her from the house. After her mother's death, Marikolunthu takes care of her child mercilessly, due to anger, she mortgages him at one of the Murugesan's 100 ms for Rs.5000/-. The turning point in her life comes when she sees the dead body of Murugesan burning at the pyre. All the hatred towards Murugesan has gone with the flames of him. She finally thinks at her child and makes up her mind to bring back him. She is surrounded by social and financial problem. The resolve to bring back her child enables a new chapter in her life. Women's loneliness, illiteracy, dependence ignorance and frustration, has made men dominance in the society. She undergoes humiliation and debasement in her life, so far.

Margaret Shanti - An Innocent Girl

Margaret's marriage to Ebenezer Paulraj like a fair tale for her. Her husband loves her from the bottom of his heart, but not ready to accept he lives and dislikes, dreams and aims. her freedom has been tied with her hands, which is portrayed by Anita Nair. The heavy depression of Margaret gave her physical and mental sufferings Anita Desai quotes "understanding was scant, love was meager" (89) in *the novel Cry the Peacock*.
