

A SURVEY STUDY ON DURRIES OF NAKODAR, PUNJAB (INDIA)

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ABSTRACT

In India has a rich and diverse tradition in the field of textile. It is perhaps the world's oldest textile tradition. Most Indian flat weaves are known as Durries and these are made entirely from cotton. Durries are also used as bedcovers and on walls as form of decoration. This study is an attempt to find out the design techniques in Durries. This study was conducted in Nakodar (Punjab). Data was collected by interview cum survey method from 30 respondents in Nakodar was analysed and tabulated. It is found that majority of respondents were used recently developed designs and 23.4 per cent respondents were used two decades old designs and very few 16.6 per cent respondents were used a decade old designs to making Durries.
